At an urgency meeting held March 18, 2011 the Executive Committee reviewed budget and program options to address a budget shortfall with the Household Hazardous Waste Facility (HHWF) funded by the JPA. The Executive Committee is recommending your Board approve Option B as the best alternative and allow the HHWF to stockpile materials as long as they do not present a public safety concern.

Summary

Re:

For the past few years the budget for the HHWF has persistently grown and required use of its budget reserves annually. Past JPA Board direction has been to keep the facility readily available at no cost to the public with convenient hours of operation. This policy reflected a desire of the JPA Board to encourage the public to do the right thing with its hazardous waste, and keep hazardous waste out of the landfill or disposed in another inappropriate manner.

For the current fiscal year, at Board direction, San Rafael Fire Department has been in the process of renegotiating the contract with HHWF management with a goal to reduce costs. With a new contract in mind the HHWF budget was reduced for FY 2010-2011. Unfortunately, the costs of the HHWF have continued to increase and the draft audit staff recently received from John Maher, CPA reveals the HHWF budget ended last fiscal year with a negative \$189,233 fund balance.

The combination of a reduced current year budget, negative carryover and steadily increasing costs has left the HHWF budget depleted. Invoices for February 2011 has not yet been received, but assuming they track the previous seven months, it is estimated the budget will have a estimated negative balance of \$549,212 at the end of the current fiscal year.

The agreements with the City of San Rafael and the corresponding agreement with the HHWF do not specify hours of operation, but do specify a ninety day termination period, and that the member agencies will hold the City of San Rafael harmless for any cost overruns. For example, it is estimated a three day per week operation would cost an additional \$281,284 for the 3 month time period between April 1 and the end of the fiscal year on June 30.

## It is recommended you:

- 1. Approve a \$250,000 dry period loan from the JPA Zero Waste Budget to HHWF Budget to mitigate the immediate cash shortage. The Zero Waste Funds budgeted for the Zero Waste Grant program will not need be distributed until next fiscal year and those funds can be used if needed.
- 2. Consider the three options below reducing the hours of operation of the HHWF this fiscal year to accommodate a budget shortfall. The Executive Committee reviewed the options at their March 18, 2011 meeting and has recommended option B. The fiscal impact of the following three options are attached for the final 3 months of this fiscal year:
  - A. Reduce the hours of operation from the current six days a week to three days a week.
  - B. Reduce the hours of operation from the current six days a week to three days a week and defer facility disposal and transportation costs until FY 11-12.
  - C. Keep the HHWF operation open six days a week and make no change in operation.

As you can see from the attached spread sheet only option "B" (open three days a week and deferral of costs) can be funded within the various JPA budget resources. Both option "A" (open three days a week) and option "C" (open six days a week) will require a loan this fiscal year from member agencies. All options will require increased tipping fees next year to increase reserves and repay any loan. The current tipping fee for the HHW is \$3.90 per ton. If no change is made to the operation, it is estimated the FY 2011-2012 HHW tipping fee will exceed \$8.00 per ton as revenue requirements will be approximately \$2.8 million.
