Call to Order. The LTF Meeting came to order at 8:35AM

- 1. Open Time for Public Comment None.
- 2. <u>Approval of the August 7, 2013 JPA Local Task Force Minutes</u>
  M/s Stadtner, Kies to approve the minutes from the August 7, 2013 LTF meeting. The motion passed unanimously.
- 3. <u>Presentations on Extended Producer Responsibility and CalRecycle Funding</u>
  Two presentations were provided in the LTF packet and Member Haskell provided his thoughts on local "Extended Producer Responsibility" efforts not relying upon the "P" in that producers are still largely not having to step in and take responsibility to manage the waste from the products they produce. No action was necessary.

# 4. Sausalito Waste Characterization Study

Staff outlined the findings of the Waste Characterization Study completed by Sausalito. Staff noted that the Study points out there remains a large amount of compostable organics in the waste stream – and confirms the direction of the JPA's outreach effort (as a product of the stakeholder interviews) to focus on food waste reduction and composting. No action was necessary.

## 5. Updates from LTF Subcommittees

LTF Members provided updates on the progress made by the subcommittees since the last meeting noting; meeting dates, issues discussed, and spoke on possible future meeting dates.

C&D/Asphalt Shingles Subcommittee reported: Expanding the Roofs to Roads program to include a pilot tar and gravel component, conducting outreach, and requested feedback from Members on the County C&D Ordinance. Staff suggested incorporating the proposed changes into a draft document which could then be provided to the JPA Board at a later time. The subcommittee will meet September 25 from 2-3pm, at the Marin Builders Association.

EPR, Sharps & Pharmaceuticals subcommittee reported: not meeting. Future meeting dates were not identified.

JPA Long Term Funding subcommittee reported: not meeting. Expressed the need for assistance in determining the direction of the committee and to develop a long term plan. Staff stated that, unlike many other regional agencies, the mechanism for JPA revenue is not based on disposal tonnages but rather on a fee assessment. Members expressed agreement in generation of more resources to meet the JPA 2025 goal. Future meeting dates were not identified.

No action was necessary.

6. Recent and Ongoing Activities

No report tendered due to lack of time.

7. Open Time for Member Comments None. No action was necessary.
