Appointment to this vacancy will be considered by the JPA Board at a future Board Meeting, date to be determined. To help identify potential conflicts of interest, any applicant selected for the LTF is required to disclose certain financial interests, if any, via a CFPPC Form 700 each year as specified in the JPA Conflict of Interest Code.
