Tis the season to keep your tree out of landfill!

Join us in composting your Christmas tree to create healthy soils.

General Guidelines for All Trees:

- Remove the tree stand.
- Remove all decorations: lights, ornaments, tinsel, etc.
- Plastic / flocked trees cannot be composted and must go in landfill.
- If you live in an apartment building, ask the landlord to set up one day for tree collection for the building.

Curbside Collection:

Bay Cities Refuse

• No date restrictions: put your tree on the curb or cut it to fit in your green bin. Trees 7ft+ must be cut in half.

Marin Sanitary Service

- 1/6/25 1/17/25 place your tree on the curb on your regular collection day. Trees 6 ft+ must be cut in half.
- Or, cut your holiday tree into pieces and place it in your green compost cart, as long as the lid closes.
- Trees set out after 1/17/25 may be collected for \$5.00. Customers must call to request pick-up after 1/17/25.

Mill Valley Refuse Service

- 1/2/25 1/19/25 place your tree on the curb on your regular collection day. Trees 5 ft+ must be cut in half.
- Or, cut your holiday tree into pieces and place it in your green compost cart, as long as the lid closes.
- After 1/19/25 an additional fee may apply.

Recology Sonoma Marin

- For customers in Novato: 1/6/25 1/10/25 place your tree on the curb, or cut up the tree and place in your cart (lid must close).
- For customers in West Marin: Either cut up the tree to fit inside your green cart (lid must close), or drop off your tree at a drop-off location.

Tamalpais Community Services District

- 1/7/25 1/10/25 place your tree on the curb on your regular collection day.
- Or, cut your holiday tree into 2 foot pieces and place it in your green compost cart, as long as the lid closes.
- \$30 charge for collection before 1/7 or after 1/10.

Marin Resource Recovery Center:

During the month of January, customers can drop off up to 2 trees for free at 565 Jacoby St in San Rafael. There will be a charge for flocked trees.

Point Reves: 12/26/24 - 1/17/25

Point Reves Fire Station (4th & B St), 8am - 5pm.

Drop off at Marin Art & Garden Center, 30 Sir Francis Drake Drive. Do **not** drop off trees at the fire station.

Sausalito: 12/27/24 - 1/31/25

Drop off at the MLK parking lot off Coloma Street.
