



Zero Waste Marin is subsidizing local compost for Marin's farms and gardens.

Zero Waste Marin and West Marin Compost have launched a cost-sharing program to help local farms and gardens utilize high-quality, locally-produced compost and mulch products.

Who is eligible?

Any agricultural producer in Marin County, including:

- ✓ Ranches
- ✓ Farms
- ✓ School & community gardens
- ✓ Other local producers

What are the guidelines?

- ✓ The compost or mulch must be used in Marin County.
- ✓ Products must be used for soil conditioning, water retention, carbon sequestration, or other agricultural uses.
- ✓ Purchases must be 5 cubic yards or greater.

How does the program work?

Zero Waste Marin will cover 50% of the cost of the qualifying products from West Marin Compost. The end-user will cover the remaining 50% of the cost, and transportation as needed. All recipients must complete ZWM's 1-page Compliance Form.

Are there any deadlines?

Compost or mulch must be purchased from West Marin Compost by 6/30/2026. Purchased products must be used by 12/31/2026.
